Bridport's **Fingerprint Dance** is hosting **Kynourio Soma's *Earth My Earth***, a community-led environmental project bringing together local people of all ages to explore environmental responsibility through creative participation and practical action.

Originally developed in Arcadia, Southern Greece (2025), the project adapts to each place it is hosted. For the Dorset edition, it will focus on textile waste and the environmental impact of fast fashion, including the issue of waste colonialism.
